Gina Debrincat – part 2 Etymology

Definitions:

- Repent: metanoia – to go beyond the mind
- Taste: to perceive or recognize as if by the sense of taste, to become acquainted with by experience, the distinctive quality of experience
- See: to perceive or detect as if by sight, to become aware of; recognize, to imagine as a possibility- supposed to form a mental picture of – visualize, to perceive the meaning or importance of, to have experience of,
- Throne: the chair (a seat) of state of a sovereign or high dignitary, as into crown – enthrone, institute, install, elect, inaugurate, anoint, ordain, vote in, consecrate. We are to be the sovereign here! We are to sit in that seat, in that Christed position of authority, in the Spirit, in intention, by our thought, words, emotions and deeds.
- Inspire: to influence, move or guide by divine or supernatural influence or action; to breathe or to blow into, to infuse
- Poise: to carry or hold in equilibrium, to hold or carry in a particular way, to put into readiness, gracious tact in coping or handling
- Sovereignty: a supreme power, freedom from external control, autonomy, over, above, absolute
- Muse: meditate, ponder, wonder, marvel
- Meditate: to engage in contemplation or reflection, to engage in mental exercise such as breathing or a mantra for heightened spiritual awareness, to focus on thoughts, to intend or purpose, muse
- Mandatory (in the legal sense): a voluntary act, if the government says it is mandatory, it actually means that you may comply if you give your consent, otherwise, it does not apply to you and it is not law because you have not consented. Your acquiescence makes it a law for you. {Must... has the same meaning}
- Voluntary: proceeding from the will or from one's own choice or consent, self-determining, done by design or intention; acting on one's free will without valuable consideration or legal obligation, of, relating to, subject to, or regulated by the will, having power of free choice
- Benevolent: marked by or disposed to doing good; bene meaning good and 'velle meaning volition, referring to the power to make one's own choices or decisions and voluntary
- Divine: relating to or proceeding directly from God; being a deity; directed to a deity; to discover by intuition or insight; to seek to predict future events or discover

hidden knowledge usually by the interpretation of omens or by the aid of supernatural powers; to perceive intuitively; the ability to transcend perceived human limitation.

- Transcend: to become more, to go beyond the range of limitation, including the limits we put upon ourselves
- Govern: to direct and control the actions or conduct of, either by established laws or by arbitrary will; to direct and control, rule or regulate, by authority. To be a rule, precedent, law or deciding principle for.
- Governance: holding the superiority, prevalent, controlling, responsible for making and enforcing rules and laws; to exercise continuous and sovereign authority over, especially to control and direct the making and administration
- Government: Govern means control and 'ment' means mind. You do the math on this one!
- Conviction: the strong persuasion of belief, the state of being convinced, assurance, certitude, certainty
- Renew: to make like new, restore to freshness, vigor or perfection; to make new spiritually, revive, regenerate, rebuild, replace, replenish
- Frequency: the number of waves (as of sound or electromagnetic energy) that passes a fixed point each second; the number of times per second that an electric current flowing in one direction, changed direction, then changes back
- Vibration: the act of creating sound or frequency
- Resounding: producing or characterized by resonant sound; resonating
- Sound: Mechanical radiant energy that is transmitted by longitudinal pressure waves in a material medium (such as air) and is the objective cause of hearing, a speech sound, the impression conveyed, meaning, voice, proclaim, resound, to give summons by sound; sound emphasizes the absence of disease, weakness or malfunction; flawless reasoning; solid grounding; lucidity; overcoming doubt or opposition; reluctance to accept; striking the heart of the matter; free from error or fallacy, exhibiting or based on thorough knowledge and experience, logically valid and having true premises, **to look into or investigate the possibility**
- Hear: to perceive or become aware by ear; to gain knowledge by hearing; to listen to with attention; heed; attend; to give a listening; to take testimony; to have capacity of perceiving sound, become aware of sound; to gain information; to receive communication; to entertain the idea; the middle English 'heren' from the Latin 'covere' means **to be on guard**
- Listen: to pay attention to sound; to hear something with thoughtful attention; give consideration; to be alert; to give ear to; middle English, 'listnen' from the Old English 'hlyshan' (close to the Sanskrit word 'srosti', means to hear loudly.

· Intention: what one intends to bring about; a determination (and just a note, the first part of this word is 'deter'); a resolve; import; significance; concept; considered as a product of attention directed to an object of knowledge; aim; design; idea; objective; target; goal; what one has in mind to do or bring about; a carefully calculated plan.
